

Demonstrating a keen interest in heritage and in environmental design, in 2010 Elisa formed part of a small team to develop proposals for an international design competition for the regeneration of a quarter within the historic centre of the city of Fez, in Morocco. She was also involved in the office's successful application for EU funding for a research project (NEPTUME), designed to develop natural and mechanical solutions, appropriate to the local setting, for the treatment of municipal effluent to provide irrigation water for the irrigation of public parks and gardens.

During her time in Malta, Elisa also developed her own research project independently. Her, 'Malta Reuse Map', is now a functioning web-site, an exchange portal which tracks the availability of reclaimed building materials for re-use in new developments. Her project was selected to represent Malta at the European Week for Waste Reduction 2010, and in March this year Elisa received an award for the project from the EU Commission.
